## December Board Meeting

First of all, some good news – or, as the Treasurer put it, Christmas has come early – we have finally received the missing FIT payments, some of which have been outstanding since 2022. After a lot of effort and a fair amount of time put in by trustees (mainly spent going round in circles, making repeated phone/email requests to the energy company, and banging our heads against the wall), and with the help of Community Action Northumberland, Stocksfield Community Association has received the money. The Treasurer has now contacted the energy company again for payment of the interest.

The trustees discussed improved signage for the building. The original idea of a free standing sign just below the office window was discounted as it has been pointed out that, due to the increase in the number of cars parking in front of the building during the day, the proposed sign would not be visible from the road. We are now considering placing a sign on the front wall of the building, between the doorway and the office window, and possibly a second sign on the north-facing wall.

Since the infrared heaters were fitted in August, we have two possible systems available to heat the main hall. The infrared heaters have been popular with users of the hall – they are silent, unobtrusive and clean, and as they don't rely on convection they don't heat the unused space above everyone. There have unfortunately been ongoing problems with controlling the thermostats, and we are now considering changing the controllers to ones which will be quicker and easier to operate. The gas boiler and radiators are less efficient and take longer to heat the room, but as the radiators remain warm for a long time after the boiler switches off they are useful for longer hire periods.

In terms of our environmental impact, using the gas heating is not ideal, however as trustees we also have to take costs into account. Since signing new energy contracts, we now pay significantly less for gas than for electricity. During the Summer months the solar panels generate a lot of electricity, and the new batteries and infrastructure installed in August store it very efficiently. Obviously this is not the case in Winter. We are now using the gas heating more, but not exclusively; this will change back to frequent use of the infrared heaters as the days get longer.

The manager reported that the building is well used, and that bookings are good into January and February. 2026 membership payments started to come in at the beginning of December – the membership year runs from January to December.

## January Board Meeting

We have had to replace the gas boiler that heats the first floor rooms, the office and the downstairs toilets and associated hot water supply. This broke down on Thursday 8<sup>th</sup> January; the engineer came out on the following morning and reported that the fan and the manifold had failed. This would have been an expensive repair to a fifteen year old boiler.

The trustees all agreed that replacing the boiler was the better option. This was done on Monday 12<sup>th</sup> January, in time to heat the first floor room for Puppy School and the National Childbirth Trust class. The other gas boilers and our three cookers were serviced the following day. We are grateful to our gas-safe heating engineer Ian Rogerson for responding so quickly and efficiently.

The Property Report then dealt with changing the controls for the infrared heaters to the app-controlled 'Hive' system, which will also be used to set the hall radiators. This work was successfully completed a couple of days after the board meeting. It should now be much easier for Lisa to set the heating for the main hall. The thermostats which were initially fitted for the infrared heaters have unfortunately proved to be unreliable.

An application for funding extra storage batteries has been made to the National Lottery Awards for All England – Environment. We are unlikely to hear whether we have been successful before April.

The trustees discussed the design and positioning of new signage for the building. A quote for the work has been received. The wording will simply be 'Stocksfield Community Centre'. One of the trustees is working on the design and colours. There will be further discussion before a decision is made.

The Treasurer reported a healthy surplus in December; however this will be counteracted by the unexpected cost of the new boiler in January.

The manager reported regular bookings continuing for most of December and into 2026, with continuing interest in children's parties and one-off events, such as the Christmas Wreathmaking workshop at the beginning of the month. Almost all of the regular groups don't meet over the two week period covering Christmas and New Year, so the building is unheated for most of this time. Due to the cold weather it has taken longer for the rooms to come up to temperature. Lisa is now setting the heating to come on earlier prior to bookings.
