February Board Meeting

This was a long meeting, during which the trustees discussed property matters, finance, the upcoming Hallmark 3 assessment, room hire and events. Lord and Lady Allendale will be holding their annual Bywell Castle Garden Open Day on Sunday 21st June. This year they are raising funds for Stocksfield Community Association, so we are involved in planning the event, and trustees and volunteers will be helping out at Bywell Castle during the weekend.

The socket switch on one of the Richardson Room radiators developed an intermittent fault, meaning that the radiator switched itself off and could not be controlled remotely. The socket switch has now been replaced. The electrical work in the main hall to control the infra red heaters and the radiators, mentioned in the January Report, went ahead as planned, and we are very pleased with the results.

Discussion continued regarding colour, design and positioning of new signage for the building. Costs need to be taken into account, and we are aiming to balance visibility with aesthetics. The consensus of the trustees is that white lettering on a green background would be best, provided that the colour can be roughly matched to that of the external noticeboard. There will be further discussion before a decision is made.

The Treasurer reported no change to the savings account and the one year savings bond as of 31st January. The current account shows a healthy balance, with good income from room hire and annual membership subscriptions. A formal complaint has been made to the energy company regarding non-payment of interest on delayed FIT payments and lack of action regarding our application for a SEG contract.

The manager reported steady bookings for the first few weeks of 2026, and a surge in membership subscriptions during the first week of February. The new Hive controls for the infra red heaters and for the radiators in the hall are proving to be easy to set and monitor.

SCATA Launches Housing Needs Survey

SCATA has commissioned arc4, a leading provider of housing market analysis and assessments, to undertake a detailed housing needs survey in our part of the Tyne Valley. The area covered includes Stocksfield, Prudhoe and all its neighbouring areas, Mickley, Hedley, Ovingham, Ovington and Wylam; over 8,000 households.

The study will not only build on the highly successful housing needs survey carried out in our village over a decade ago, but will provide vital insights into gaps in provision, especially gaps in affordable housing to rent. Key stakeholders, including housing associations and local councils, will also be asked to contribute to the survey.

Studies like this provide vital, up to date data and perspectives that assist local authorities, and in particular their planners, in making sound decisions with regard to the need for housing development. With the exception of the previous Stocksfield study there appears to be no detailed information available for our part of the valley.

If surveys are to be successful they really do need people to respond to the questions asked, so *please*, if you receive a survey do make a little time to complete and return it. It is only with the data that you provide that needs can be identified and sensible decisions made. Every completed survey returned contributes vital information.

SCATA is particularly grateful to Northumberland County Council's Community Housing Fund, Community Action Northumberland (CAN) and Communities CAN for their support in carrying out this survey.

The Little Things That Run in the World, the Good, the Bad, and the Ugly.

Dr. Gordon Port is a zoologist and ecologist with a lifelong interest in insects and other invertebrates. He is involved in research and teaching at Newcastle University with an emphasis on integrated pest management, invertebrate behaviour and ecology. His particular expertise is in the behaviour and biology of slugs. He has a great interest in the public understanding of science and is an Honorary Fellow of The Royal Entomological Society. He is a volunteer for the Natural History Society of Northumbria (NHSN) of which he is a trustee. He is also involved with various citizen science projects.
