A Day to Remember



Sunday 21st June – Bywell Castle Open Garden Day – and Father’s Day – dawned bright, clear and dry. A few hours later, the gardens and grounds of Bywell Castle were busy with Community Centre trustees and volunteers, Allendale family members, stallholders, band members and helpers setting up for the day. Then the members of the public started arriving – first a trickle, then a flood, with their children, dogs, friends - and, of course, their fathers.

There was the band, *Jeanie and the Jollyboys*, playing all afternoon in one part of the garden. There was face painting, the Honey Store, craft stalls and others in another area. There were quieter parts of the garden where one could stroll in the shade of the trees or sit and enjoy the peace, the sunshine and the views of the river running past the castle.

There was pizza and paella from The Feathers Inn in the castle ruins. There were sausages, burgers, and cakes to be eaten. Tyne Valley Taproom were serving beer, other vendors were offering gin and other alcoholic beverages. There was, of course, tea and coffee. What was lacking, unfortunately, was enough toilets for the unexpectedly large numbers of visitors on the day. There will be more toilets provided at any future events of this scale.

Outside of the gates, Andrea's Children's Dog Show was in full swing, and the occasional child or dog bearing a rosette was to be seen. There were Alpacas to be walked and ponies to be stroked. Back inside the gates, there were prizes to be won at the bottle tombola and the prize tombola. Families were picnicking on the grass and children were running about.

The volunteers on the gate and those on car park duty were wilting, but manfully (and womanfully) continuing to direct traffic and take entrance money. When this was eventually counted up, there was far more than we had expected, and it will make a real difference to what we can do at Stocksfield Community Centre.

However, more volunteers and /or trustees would enable us to put more events on for the community, so if you or anyone you know might like to be involved, please contact Lisa (details on the inside cover).

The Annual General Meeting of Stocksfield

Community Association took place on Tuesday 14th July 2026

Members of the board of trustees for the coming year were elected at this meeting. All current members were re-elected. No nomination forms for new trustees were received.

The trustees' annual report was published in the July/August edition of SCAN and was approved by members of the Association at the meeting.

The treasurer presented the annual accounts with his end of year 2025/26 report. The report is printed in this copy of SCAN. The accounts were approved by members of the Association at the meeting.

July Board Meeting

As always at the first board meeting following the AGM, the first main task is to elect the officers of Stocksfield Community Association, i.e. Chair, Vice-Chair, Treasurer and Minutes Secretary. All were re-elected unopposed to their previous posts.

Unfortunately, we have not yet been able to proceed with the installation of the extra batteries as planned, as the installer has been unable to source batteries which could be connected to our current batteries. This is frustrating, as our current batteries were only installed in 2024. We are now hoping to install new batteries in parallel with the current system. This will require new infrastructure which will not be covered by the grant received for the batteries. Another grant has been applied for and we will also need to use some of our reserves towards this.

Fortunately, our reserves have received a major boost from the proceeds of the Bywell Castle Open Garden Day on 21st June. As previously reported, Lady Allendale chose Stocksfield Community Association as this year's beneficiary and the Board are very grateful to her. The sun shone, a lot of people turned up and thanks to the hard work of trustees and volunteers, who helped to organize and run the event on the day, the contributions of the band, the food vendors and stallholders, and not forgetting Andrea for organizing and running the Children's Dog Show, the day was a great success. Thanks also to the Great British Weather for producing a warm, dry, sunny day.

Treasurer's AGM Summary for FY'25/'26; 10/07/2026

General Summary for FY'25-'26:

Overall, we ran a deficit last financial year, but this was mainly due to the number of infrastructure projects; ~£16k

Removing these costs, and the corresponding grants to support, the operational account shows as being positive.

As reminder the main "working" Savings & Current accounts are still being held with Unity Trust Bank, and a separate Cambridge & Counties Bank account was opened, allowing our reserve (£15k) to be put into a high interest Bond.

Annual Expenditure also down @ ~£42.5k (~-12% from last year):

There were more project/installation activities this year, including some unplanned. Salaries, wages, materials, etc., increased to reflect the current economic cost / mainly in-line with inflation & minimum wage increases.

Infrastructure Projects;	~£16k (+77% v last year):
Installation of the 3 phase invertor and new solar batteries – Oakes Energy;	~£ 7.7k
Installation of the 3 phase power supply internal works – Flash Electrical;	~£ 4.5k
Installation of the main hall IR heaters - Flash Electrical;	~£ 2k
Unplanned New boiler (upstairs) – Ian Rogerson;	~£ 2.5k

After Salaries, Utilities continue to be a largest general spends:

Salaries were down to ~£13k; (-£6k - working hours being reduced).

Electric /Gas / Water down to ~£ 6.7k (-3.5k; ~-34% from last year).

Insurances down to ~£2.6k; (~-10% from last year).

Unplanned IT spends ; photocopier; Microsoft Licencing; ~£1.1k

(An unsupported spend of £2.71 had to be added to “Misc. Expenditure” to achieve a balanced account).

The End of year Bank & cash balances @ £ 25,262.41 are a reduction -£5,987.21 from FY’24/’25 accounts.

This is not surprising as we had a ~16% deficit; but this year we had the Main Hall heating project ;3rd phase install and new batteries; future proofing the centre for the years to come.

Despite this drop in reserves, we are still in a reasonably healthy financial position; considering works undertaken.

The accounts have been independently examined and certified as being correct.

They have also been presented and approved by the Board at a meeting in July.

It has now been approved at the AGM.

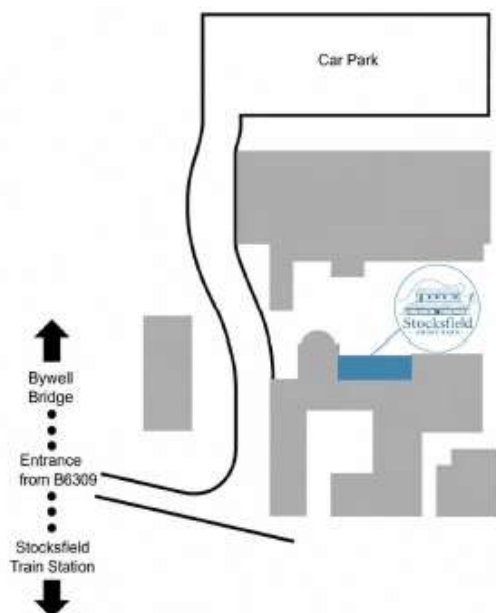

Thank you to everyone who attended the Bywell Arts Festival, during 26-28 June 2026

St Peter's Day fell on 29th June, and in recent decades the congregation of St Peter's Church in Bywell have celebrated their patron by holding the Bywell Arts Festival over the last weekend in June. At the centre of the festival is an exhibition of original art displayed in St Peter's and also in nearby St Andrew's Church, which is in the care of the Churches Conservation Trust. In 2025 we were delighted to attract over 500 visitors, which spurred us on to repeat the event in 2026.

The two churches, both dating back to Saxon times, make a beautiful backdrop for an art exhibition but they weren't built for displaying paintings and of course you can't just hammer picture hooks into ancient church walls!

There is no running water at the Bywell churches, so even the water used for teas and coffees needs to be transported! It's a huge amount of work, but it always seems worthwhile when the result is hundreds of visitors coming to see the art and to enjoy spending time in Bywell. There are many people to thank and I hope I'm forgiven for not naming them individually here. Volunteers are drawn from our own parish and also friends from the wider local community, including some of the exhibiting artists, who give their time freely to help stage the event. Local businesses also support us by supplying fabulous prizes for the festival raffle, which is a great contributor to our fundraising. And of course, we must thank the hundreds of visitors who attended, because without you, there would be no event!

Whilst Bywell is usually a peaceful spot, it's wonderful to welcome so many visitors, to have the peace and quiet interrupted by the buzz of friendly chatter and laughter. I particularly like the idea that we sit in the churchyard, surrounded by the graves of people who knew Bywell hundreds of years before. Here, past meets present, providing a satisfying sense of continuity appropriate in this ancient setting, giving hope to the idea that St Peter's Church will still be here for our community to enjoy in hundreds of years to come.

We'd love to see you so do come along with suitable footwear.

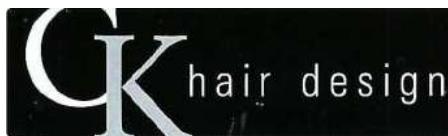
